01 What this form is

Under Rule 1.560, a court that enters judgment for money may order the judgment debtor to complete this sheet under oath and deliver it - within 45 days of the order or other reasonable time as determined by the court - to the judgment creditor or the creditor's attorney. The court's ORDER, not this kit, is what obligates anyone.

02 Open in Adobe Acrobat Reader

The free Reader is enough. Type into the fields; click a choice line to place the form's own x. Fields shared with other kits in this line (the caption, the case number) fill themselves from what you typed there.

03 The form's own commands control

The form's own boxed command controls where it goes: it is mailed or delivered to the judgment creditor (or the creditor's attorney) - it is NOT filed with the clerk of court. The oath is under penalty of perjury; complete it truthfully and completely, and attach what the form lists.

04 Where judgment is needed, bring counsel

Which category fits, which box is true for your case, and what an answer commits you to are judgment calls - a licensed Florida attorney can review your completed form at any time.

Provenance

Where every word of this form came from — and how to check.

This kit typesets THE OFFICIAL FORM'S OWN TEXT into a fillable document. It is not the court's PDF (Florida publishes the civil forms as rule text, not as statewide fillable files); it is the official text, set by this kit line, with fill-in fields at the form's own blanks.
